
Introduction

Don't expect to be great on the first try. You will learn more and more each time you draw. By putting the date on the bottom or back of your drawings you can keep track of your progress. Hang your drawings up in your room so you can look at them and see what you can improve on. Just have fun drawing and you will see your drawing skills improve each day.



How to Use This Book


You will notice there are different colored lines in each drawing step. Blue lines are the new steps. Black lines are the lines done in a previous step and gray lines are lines not needed in the final drawing.




When you first start drawing make sure to draw very light. Many of the shapes and lines you start with are guides and will not be needed in the finished drawing.


You don't need to erase the gray lines in each step as you draw. In the final step press harder with your pencil and trace over the lines want to keep. You can even go over the final step with a black pen.






A trick that most artists use when drawing is a sheet of tracing paper. Sketch your drawing following the steps in the book. When you are finished lay a sheet of tracing paper over your finished sketch. Now trace over the lines you want to keep in your final drawing.









